#### **CHANGES TO THE COUNTY CODE RELATING TO LAND DEVELOPMENT FEES AND DEPOSITS AND SUBDIVISION MONUMENTATION**

On December 3, 2003, the County Code changed, to provide full cost recovery for services relating to development projects and permit processing. Two such changes that affect Land Surveyors are "Subdivision Monument Inspection" and the "Records of Survey Fees."

#### **Subdivision Monument Inspection:**

Current practice was for the County Surveyor to inspect all subdivision monuments upon completion of improvement installation. This would typically pose a problem for the County since as-built conditions of many subdivisions often made it extremely difficult for County personnel to locate monuments. This process would inevitably cost the developer a considerable amount of money to complete. California law requires the engineer or surveyor retained by the developer, not the County, to verify that monuments have been set.

Effective February 8, 2004, the County Surveyor will only be required to inspect subdivision monuments placed along and within public rights-of-way; however, the surveyor will have the option for requesting the County Surveyor to inspect all the monuments, based on a full cost recovery schedule.

#### **Record of Survey Fee:**

The current process of charging a flat rate regardless of the size of a record of survey map was always seen as an

inequitable method. The fees have been the same whether for a one-sheet map or a 50-sheet map. The one and two sheet maps are typically prepared for the mom and pop surveys and the larger maps for utilities and municipalities.

Effective July 1, 2004, the new ROS fee, for initial submittal, will change to \$400 for the first sheet and \$50 for each additional sheet. To put this in perspective of where the volume of work is, the County Surveyor records approximately 400 Records of Survey annually. Of that, approximately 330 are one page maps and another 25 are two page maps.

Held on Saturday, April 24, 2004 at the Doubletree Hotel, in Ontario CA

### Approval of Minutes; January 2004 Board of Directors meeting

Minutes Approved

- Officers and Committee Reports

- President's Bob Hart

President Bob Hart reported attending a meeting, initiated by Robert Abbott, regarding the formation of a new chapter. The new chapter would consist of Solano, Napa and potentially Contra Costa counties. Criteria for forming a new chapter, as outlined in the CLSA Bylaws, is *any group of ten or more Corporate members of the Association. Geographic boundaries need not be considered (Section 8.03).*

President Bob Hart reported CLSA's activity on a national level is continuing to grow. NSPS has appointed Carl C. deBaca the chairman of the newly formed NAFTA-MRD Review Committee. (See NAFTA Below)

- President Elect's Report – Armand Marois

President-Elect Armand Marois visited the East Bay Chapter in February and the Riverside/San Bernardino Chapter in March. Armand is scheduled to attend Sonoma County, Orange County and Channel Islands Chapters.

- Secretary's Report – Robert Reese

Executive Committee is considering the development of shorter version of the CLSA standard contract. Motion to spend \$500 on review of short form contract by legal counsel. Motion Carried.

- Treasurer's Report – Carl C. deBaca

2004 Financial Statement is included in the Agenda. Total Assets = \$448038.62

- Immediate Past President's Report – Ray Mathe (not in attendance)

- Executive Director's Report – Dorothy Calegari

Reported on the 2004 CLSA/NALS Conference. There were 631 total attendees, 437 of which were full paid registrants. 56% of the full paid registrants were from California. The ACSM-CLSA-NALS-WFPS Conference will be held March 18-23, 2005 at the Riviera Hotel.

2006 will be CLSA's 40th anniversary. The possibility of hosting a CLSA only (not joint) conference was discussed. 2006 Conference will be placed on July agenda and a motion can be entertained.

### Report on Executive Committee Meeting(s)/Action – Carl C. deBaca

#### NAFTA – Mutual Recognition Document (MRD)

Carl C. deBaca, Chairman of the NSPS NAFTA-MRD Review Committee, provided background information on the NAFTA-MRD.

1992 – NAFTA was signed between 3 countries (U.S., Canada and Mexico)

1993 – NSPS formed a NAFTA Committee, chaired by Malcolm Shaw to explore ramifications of the Agreement. A similar committee was formed in Canada.

1996 – NAFTA Committee to start communications with Canada and Mexico

1997 – NSPS sent letter to U.S. Trade Commission informing the Commission that NSPS would be speaking for U.S. Surveyors in negotiating a Mutual Recognition Document (MRD).

1998 – Formal meeting with 3 countries

1998 to 2002 – 8 meetings held. Produced 6 different drafts of the NAFTA-MRD. The 7th draft was considered complete and was presented to the NSPS Board of Directors. The NSPS Board of Directors accepted the NAFTA-MRD and directed that it be sent to the U.S. Trade Commission and NCEES for review.

- CLSA reviewed the NAFTA-MRD and sent a letter objecting to the two-tiered system. NCEES was copied on the letter.
- NCEES forwarded the NAFTA-MRD to the United States Council for International Engineering Practice (USCIEP) as well as having it reviewed by legal council.
- NCEES sent a letter to NSPS on December 22, 2003 outlining their concerns and encouraging NSPS to collaborate with NCEES, Member Boards and CLSA in addressing these concerns prior to signing the agreement.
- The first meeting of the newly formed NAFTA-MRD Review Committee was held in Nashville on April 16, 2004. NSPS directed the committee to review the document and suggest change in existing language. The Committee is not authorized to rewrite the entire document. A new paragraph addressing the two-tiered system has been written for states with an expanded definition of surveying to offer reciprocity in the form of allowing candidates to sit for the exam. Once the language is cleaned up it will be circulated to member boards, CLSA and NCEES for review.

- Education Division:

Education Foundation:

Chairman Armand Marois reported the annual Scholarship Auction raised over \$18,000. Approximately \$13,000 is CLSA's share. Armand reported the Foundation bylaws are being reviewed and the formation of new scholarships is being considered. Chapters are encouraged to team with the CLSA Education Foundation in offering scholarships. By doing so, chapters can review all applications received by the foundation and have a larger pool of potential recipients to choose from.

- Legislative Division:

Executive Director Dorothy Calegari reviewed the legislative process. Chapters are encouraged to submit items to the Legislative Committee by utilizing the "Worksheet on Proposed Legislation" form included in the Board Handbook.

-Professional Practice Committee:

Guest member Bruce Pierce reported on fraudulent surveys being conducted for over 3 years using his LS number, signature and seal to record maps without a license. A letter, written by Bruce, with all details is posted on the CLSA Discussion Board.

- Membership Division:

Approximately 300 members have not paid 2004 dues. Central Office will email a list of members still owing dues to chapters. Each chapter is encouraged to contact members in their area and encourage payment of dues.

**DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD:**

Phil Danskin was awarded the Distinguished Service Award for his years of dedicated service to CLSA and the land surveying profession as editor of the California Surveyor.

**NSPS Governor:**

CLSA is asking for NSPS support regarding opposition to the Model Law. There are currently 170 NSPS members from California. NSPS would like to build its California membership base.

**Trig Star Program:**
